What is a Reference List?

A **Reference list** is a list of all resources that were used during the writing of an essay, project or assignment. A **Reference list** is <u>always</u> listed in <u>alphabetical order</u>.

Do not list under headings by type of resource and <u>do not number</u>, as they are in alphabetical order.

Below is an example of how a book is arranged in a **Reference list**.

```
(Author's surname and initials) (Title in italics) (Name of Publisher)

King, S.F. (2009). Science and time. Longman. (Year of publication)

Internet: Please ensure full internet address is given.

Author. (Year). *Title of Article/Document*. http://www_address...

If no author/s can be identified then use the name of the Government Department or Company name etc., to start the reference.

Company or Department name (Year). *Title of article/document*. http://www.address...

PLEASE NOTE: the URL no longer requires the hyperlink to be removed. i.e. the web address can be copied and pasted to your Reference List and remain blue and underlined.

HANDY TIPS

Each entry begins flush with the left hand margin.

This is an alphabetical list of all the references you have used in the assignment.

Each entry is in alphabetical order according to the last name of the author, editor, title of article or title of source if no author exits.

If there is no clear year when article was published then use (n.d) for the year.

Second line and all subsequent lines of a reference is **indented**, i.e. you tab over
